Now, you too can book a ride in a vintage Warbird C-47 Skytrain or a P-51D Mustang. Taking to the skies in one of these Warbirds is an unforgettable experience.

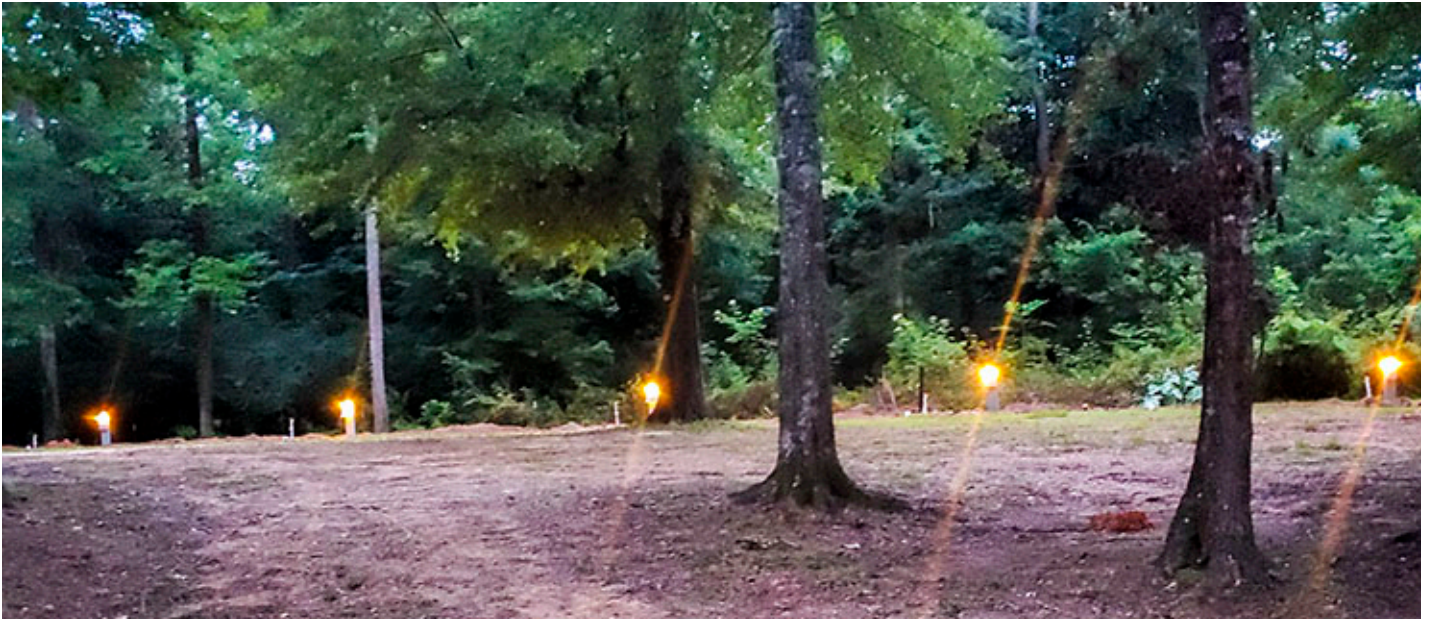
Great art takes concentration
